## Natural Wine / Low-Intervention

Natural wine doesn't have an official definition, but it follows some key principles:

In the vineyard, organic farming is a must – no artificial substances allowed.

In the winery, the approach is hands-off. Natural yeasts, not the ones from a laboratory, are used. No playing around with things like acidity or water by using additives.

Wines are unfiltered and unfined, with minimal sulphites added for preservation.

Our wine selection is carefully curated by selecting different vineyards in Europe who in our opinion express the terroir and grape varieties in the most accurate ways.

So, why choose natural wine?

It's about embracing nature's way. These wines capture the essence of the winemaker, the terroir and offer freshness and a genuine, unaltered character. They're a true reflection of the winemaking process, from vineyard to glass.

At Bonne Nouvelle we believe in these principles and select our wines following these quality guidelines we set for ourselves. We regularly visit most of our winemakers, import their wines and exclusively work with distributors who share the same philosophy as us. All these beautiful wine makers and distributors are who give this wine list its unique character.

## Sparkling Wine

Our sparkling wine list consists of all types of bubbles, from easy going Pet Nat or ancestral styles to fancy champagnes or cremants. They can be white or rosé but also red or orange. Here are some explanations to guide you smoothly through our wine list. For more information do not hesitate to look through the selection with our staff!

**Pétillant Naturel**, aka '**Pet Nat**' are sparkling wines which finish their fermentation in the bottle. They get bottled with residual sugar and yeast which sparks a secondary fermentation inside the bottle and leads to them being sparkling and sometimes a little bit more fun and out of control.

**Champagne** is a sparkling wine produced in the Champagne region of France. It undergoes a secondary fermentation in the bottle, known as méthode champenoise, and is typically made from Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, and Pinot Meunier. It's known for its fine bubbles, complex flavours, and ageing potential. At Bonne Nouvelle we follow the same philosophy with Champagne as with all our other wines.

Originally the term for Champenois wines which were a little less fizzy as “Champagne”, nowadays describes sparkling wines which originate from regions outside of Champagne and made with a wider array of grape varieties. So basically the same as champagne, just not from the region and with more flexibility in regards to the grape varieties. **Cava** is basically the Spanish version of cremant! Same as with champagne the wines are re-fermented in the bottle to get their bubbles.

## **Sour Beers & Co-Ferments**

Our selection of sour beers, spontaneously fermented brews, and ciders offers a range of tart, wild, and refreshing drinks. From tangy sours to more complex co-ferments, these beverages focus on natural fermentation with unpredictable outcomes. Whether you're familiar with these styles or trying them for the first time, feel free to ask our staff for guidance or recommendations

**Co-ferments** bring together the best of both worlds by blending fruit and grains during fermentation. These hybrids can combine cider with beer, or even include grapes and other fruits. The result is a drink that's a little bit beer, a little bit cider (or wine), and a whole lot of fun. Co-ferments are all about creativity and breaking traditional boundaries, making them perfect for adventurous drinkers looking for something truly unique.

**Spontaneously fermented beers** rely on wild yeast and bacteria from the surrounding environment, rather than cultured yeast, to kickstart fermentation. The most famous example of this style is the Belgian lambic. These beers are often brewed in open-air vats, allowing airborne natural microorganisms to influence the flavor. The result is a beer that is truly of its place, often funky, earthy, and sour, with deep layers of complexity that evolve over time.

**Ciders** are fermented beverages made from apples (and sometimes pears). They can range from dry to sweet, and from still to sparkling. Much like wine, ciders can express the terroir of the orchards they come from, with a crisp, refreshing bite or a more robust, tannic profile. Our list includes everything from classic dry English-style ciders to funky, wild-fermented varieties that blur the line between cider and beer.

## White Wine

While strolling through our white wines you will come across the word “**orange**” quite a lot. Don't worry these wines are not made out of oranges.

While conventional white wines are usually directly pressed, orange wines spend more time in contact with the grape skins and thus develop a slightly more orange colour. The skin contact, which is also called maceration, also helps the wine to start its fermentation process and to develop specific flavour compounds which you wouldn't find in conventional wines.

To make things easy to understand, imagine making your usual cup of tea in the morning. The longer you leave the bag in the water the more flavour and bitterness develops in the tea. The same happens when making red wine.

Basically the longer the red wine grape varieties stay in contact with the juice, the redder the wine will become. On the other hand, you can make very light red wines by leaving them less long on the skins.

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## Red Wine

When thinking about red wine, you might tend to think about heavy, oaky and wines that should be drunk at room temperature. At Bonne Nouvelle we take a different approach towards red. The reds we serve are primarily fruit and terroir driven. Since in our opinion these characteristics hardly shine when the wine is too warm, we serve all of our wines chilled at the Bar. Sometimes maybe too chilled (let the wine breathe for a bit and it will be just great).

For us the wine shouldn't put you to sleep but give you energy and wake you up. We chose wines which are round with a little edge to them. An edge which provokes thought and makes you think.

For light reds we suggest regions such as Pfalz, Rheinhessen, Alto Adige, Jura and Auvergne. They express freshness and the slightly colder climates.

For heavier and stronger reds you can go more south into countries which have hotter climates.

We also serve a bunch of **rosé** wines at Bonne Nouvelle. Rosé wines are made by using red wine grape varieties to then work them like white wines. Short skin contact, low in tannins, drinkability like a white wine!
